# WELCOME TO ST. CLARE

St. Clare Church celebrated its first Holy Mass on Sunday, August 17, 1913. Father Capistran Damek, O.F.M. welcomed over 30 parishioners that day. Just over one year later, on September 10, 1914, the Ven. Mother Willamine, Superioress, and Rev. Mother M. Pauline arrived at St. Clare. Four days later, the two Franciscan sisters opened the doors of St. Clare School to welcome 31 children.

Today, St. Clare Church serves over 1,000 families and St. Clare School enrolls 230 children with an enduring tradition of academic excellence within a faith-filled community. In fact, when recently surveyed, our current parents cited academic excellence, a safe, supportive environment, and strong Catholic faith formation, all underpinned by the strength of the St. Clare community, as the top reasons they send their children to St. Clare School.

Students at St. Clare School are provided with the tools they need to develop emotionally, intellectually, physically, and spiritually in a caring and creative environment. With an average class size of 25 students, students realize their full academic potential in an environment that promotes confidence and selfesteem. As important as academics are at St. Clare, we place an equal emphasis on community. Our students acknowledge the dignity and worth given by God to all people, and the entire student body, faculty, and staff participate in our school's community volunteering programs.

## KINDERGARTEN ADMISSIONS

- Parents complete and submit an online application, accepted beginning November 1
- Starting in February, parent interviews with Principal and kindergarten applicants complete Kindergarten Readiness Test (KRT)
- Parents receive KRT results and are notified of admission decision

## **1ST - 8TH GRADE ADMISSIONS**

- Parents complete and submit an online application for new students, accepted beginning November 1
- After application is submitted, St.
   Clare will arrange for parent interview with Principal, a student interview with the Learning
   Specialist and/or a student 'Shadow Day'
- Parents notified of acceptance decision
- New 8th Grade students are considered on an exception basis only

## **FEES**

- Application Fee: \$50 per student (non-refundable)
- Enrollment Fee: \$200 per student (non-refundable)
- **PIP Fee:** Billed in May of the academic year, \$25 per unfulfilled volunteer hour; up to \$750 per family (\$375 for single parent households). See Parent Involvement Program on Volunteering page for more information.
- FACTS will assess a bank processing fee of 2.85% for credit card payments. There is no charge for ACH/eCheck payments.

#### **TUITION ASSISTANCE**

- January 31, 2025: FACTS online application deadline in order to be considered for Archdiocesan and school grants
- Spring 2025: School notifies families about tuition assistance awards
- Tuition assistance is awarded using the same priority policy as admissions



# IN-PARISH TUITION DISCOUNT

St. Clare Church gives 20% of its offertory collections to St. Clare School to keep tuition rates as affordable as possible for our parish families. Since active members at St. Clare Church make this possible, we offer a tuition discount to active church members. In order to receive the in-parish tuition discount, you must be an active member of St. Clare Catholic Church with your time, talent, and treasure.



## **TIME**

As members of St. Clare Church, we take time out of our busy schedules for God. We ask that you attend Mass regularly at St. Clare Church. We encourage you to participate in our ministries, attend events and connect with others. Weekend Masses are Saturdays at 5:00 pm and Sundays at 8:30 and 10:45 am.

### **TALENT**

One way we live our faith is through service to others. We invite you to take a leadership role in one of our many ministries, or volunteer on a team or at events. There are many opportunities to give back to the parish and our greater community through volunteer efforts. We ask families to complete a minimum of 20 volunteer hours throughout the year at St. Clare Church. For volunteer opportunities, watch the weekly parish bulletin or contact the parish office. The annual volunteer period runs May 1 - April 30.

## **TREASURE**

The philosophy behind an In-Parish tuition rate is that your school tuition is offset by regular contributions to St. Clare Church. While there is no set amount to give, we ask you to contribute what you can to help sustain our parish and our ministries. We suggest a weekly donation of \$10-20 (\$40-80/month) minimum per family and giving it in a way that allows us to track it, such as using weekly offertory envelopes or online giving through the church website. We appreciate your generosity in supporting the ministries of St. Clare Church.

# BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL CARE (BASC)

Our Before and After School Care Program (BASC) provides a safe, loving, and positive environment for students before and after regular school hours. BASC is available to all children, Kindergarten through 8th Grade, who are registered students at St. Clare School.

BASC provides regularly scheduled care which guarantees childcare on days that works with your family's schedule. Drop-in care is also offered on a first-come, first-served basis- providing space is available. BASC also offers extended care on noon dismissal days. Additionally, parents may also use the BASC program to coordinate with after school activities and clubs such as MUSE, drama, or tutoring.

Our program features outdoor recreation, crafts, free play, homework time, movies (on the long cold days) and more. BASC allows your child time to socialize with schoolmates under the supervision of our state-qualified and experienced staff.

Our mission is to provide a safe, nurturing, and engaging environment that effectively supports the diverse needs of children and their families in our community.

# **VOLUNTEERING**

### PARENT INVOLVEMENT PROGRAM

We require each family to give 30 Parent Involvement Program (PIP) volunteer hours to support the school (15 hours for single-parent families). The PIP fee of \$25 per required volunteer hour is charged at the end of the school year for any uncompleted hours. Each family is responsible for tracking their own PIP hours and reporting them to PTC through their FACTS/ParentsWeb account.

#### CASE TRAINING

All new families and volunteers must complete a background check and complete Creating A Safe Environment (CASE) Volunteer Training in order to volunteer at our school. St. Clare offers several on-site trainings per year, typically in the fall. Additional training sessions are also offered throughout the year at other Archdiocesan locations.

# **FUNDRAISING**

We have two major fundraisers each year - the Auction and Color Bubble Run - along with smaller fundraising opportunities throughout the year to support our school. These opportunities help bridge the gap between the cost of tuition and the actual cost of educating our students, maintaining and upgrading our facility, providing outstanding programs and services, and more. ## **SCRIP**

You can help St. Clare earn percentage back or fundraising when you use Scrip for your everyday purchases. Scrip refers to gift cards and gift certificates that are tendered like cash. ## PARENT TEACHER COUNCIL (PTC)
